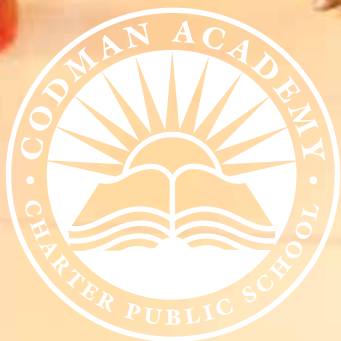

## Lower School Learning: The Journey to Discovery

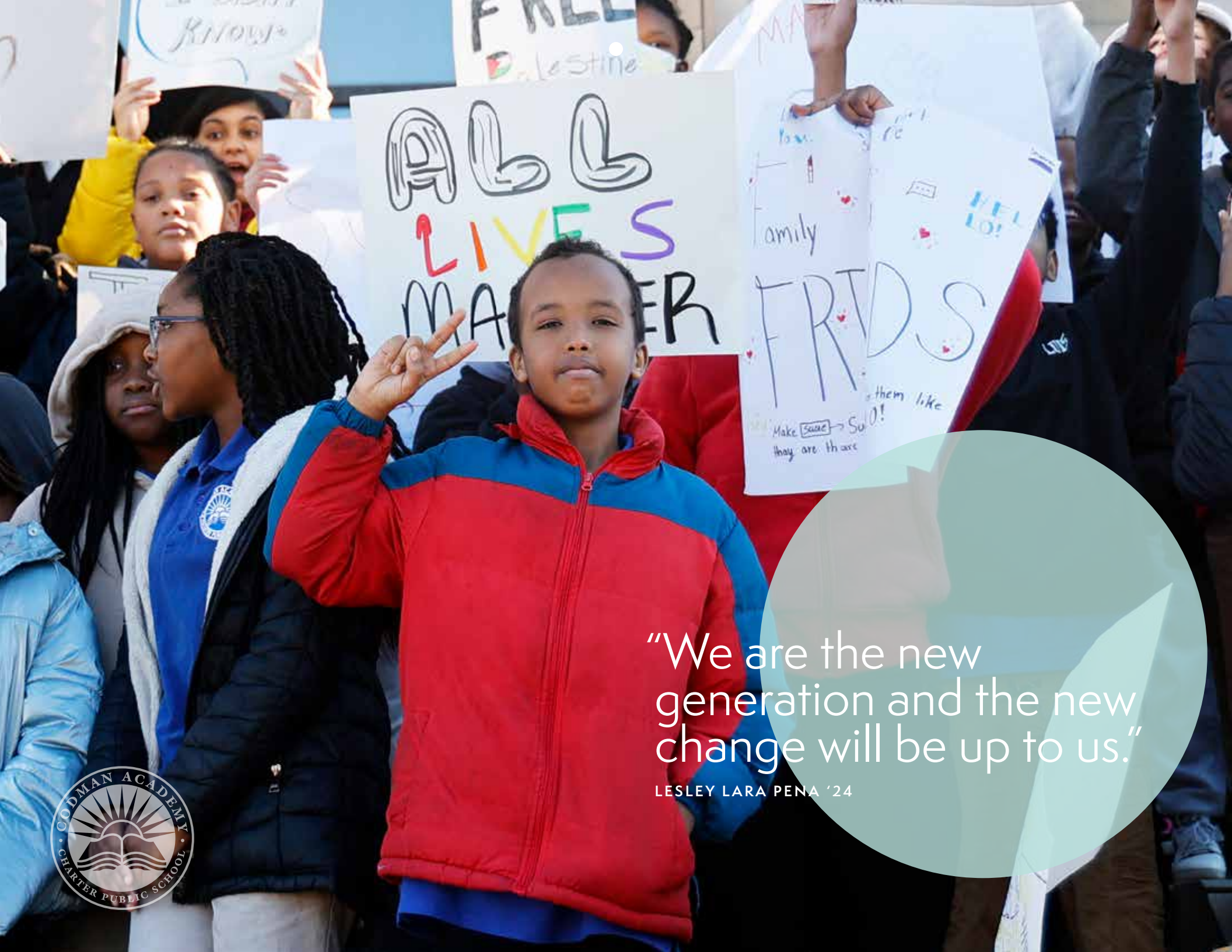


**Lower School Fish Tank:

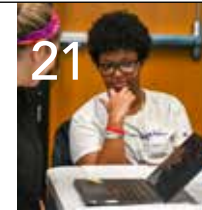

## Health Disparities Workshop with Isiah Tucker

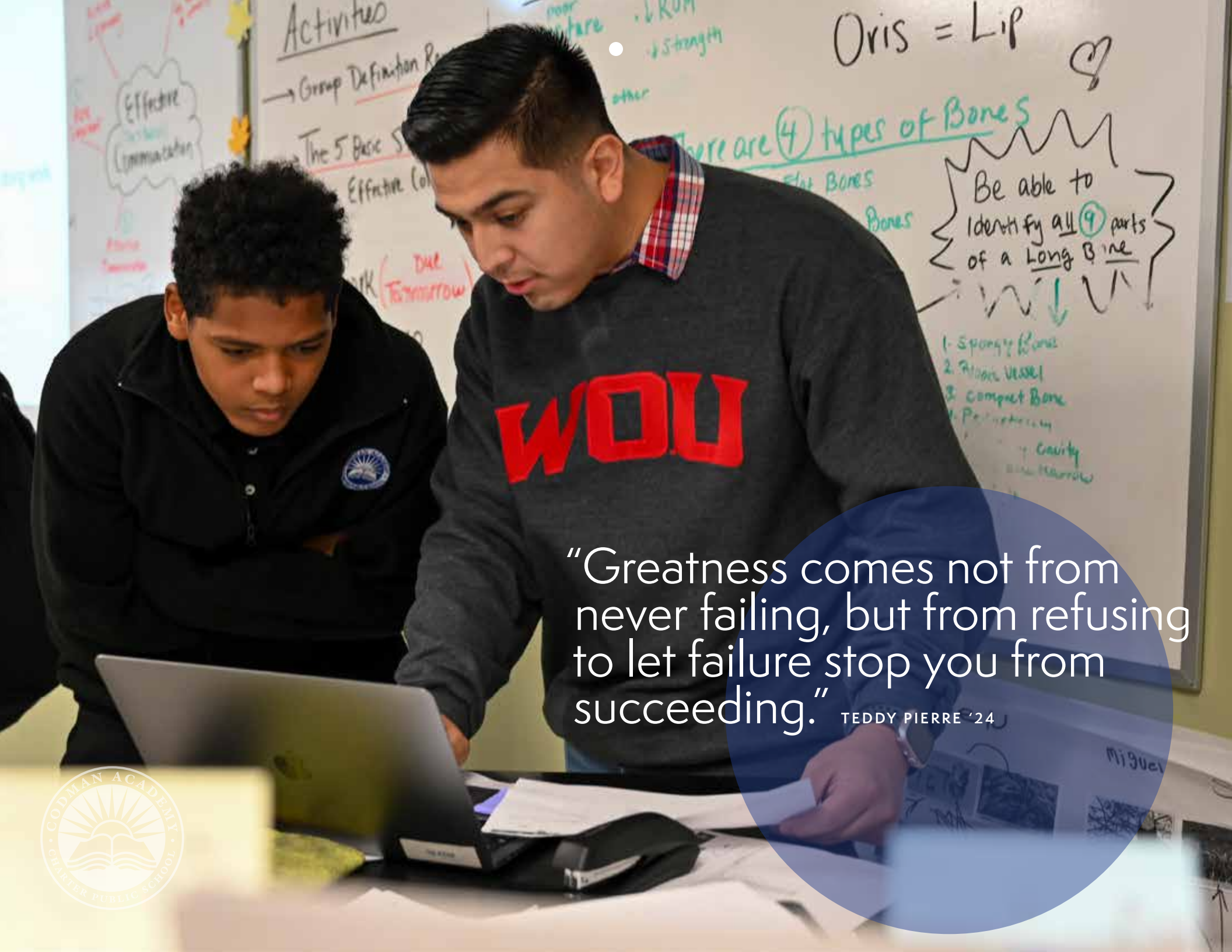

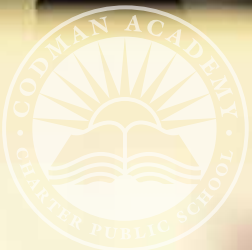

## Green Initiatives & Sustainability: The Journey to Caring for Our Planet



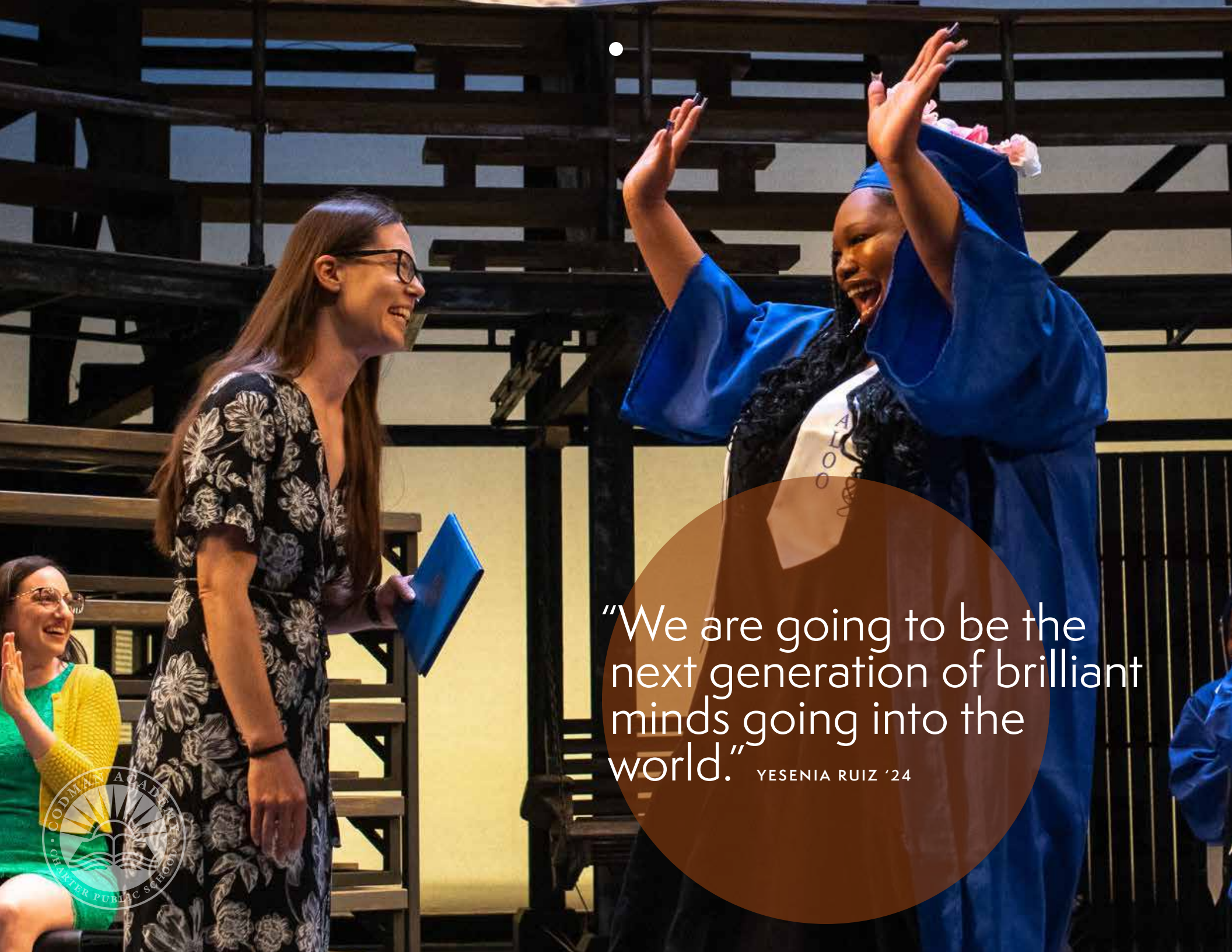
### Partnership Highlight: Holly Hill Farm

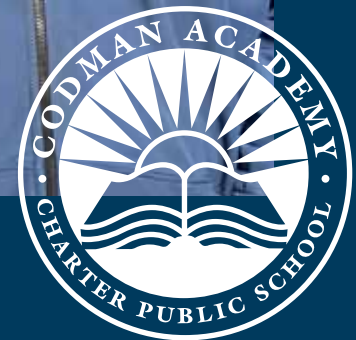
